What Is Assembly Bill 271 About?

This bill allows **commercial trucks** in Wisconsin to use **camera systems instead of traditional mirrors**—but only if those systems are **approved by federal safety regulators**.

Why Cameras Instead of Mirrors?

- Traditional mirrors can have blind spots.
- Camera systems offer better visibility, especially in poor weather or tight spaces.
- The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) already allows this at the national level.

✓ What the Bill Changes:

Wisconsin law will now match federal rules, meaning:

- Trucking companies can legally use FMCSA-approved camera systems in place of mirrors.
- This applies only to commercial motor vehicles (not personal cars or pickups).
